A message from David Buckshorn, CEO

I wanted to update you on our efforts to solve the problem of the nonprofit tax from City Council. As you know this has been a very contentious subject. I have received a great deal of support from residents and friends associated with Wesley Commons throughout the process. A recent letter from a resident hit the nail on the head by asking me why "the city would try to tax the very ones that are already bearing a great burden of supporting the growth of [the city]."

That message has been at the forefront of our discussions. The city is now considering a proposal drafted by Self Regional, Carolina Health and Wesley Commons that, we hope, will help the city during a very difficult time, while also protecting and strengthening our community as a whole. Major leaders of the city appear to be in favor of our proposal and we are hopeful that this issue will be resolved very soon.

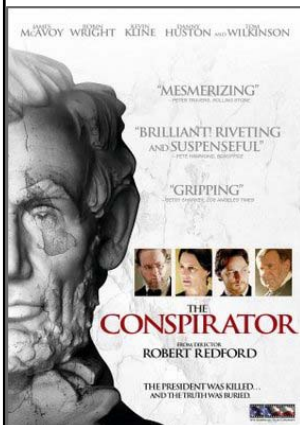

A riveting thriller, THE CONSPIRATOR tells the powerful story of a woman who would do anything to protect her family, and the man who risked everything to save her. In the wake of Abraham Lincoln's assassination, seven men and one woman are arrested and charged with conspiring to kill the President, Vice President, and Secretary of State. The lone woman charged, Mary Surratt (Wright) owns a boarding house where John Wilkes Booth (Toby Kebbell) and others met and planned the simultaneous attacks. Against the ominous back-drop of post-Civil War Washington, newly-minted lawyer, Frederick Aiken (McAvoy), a 28-year-old Union war hero, reluctantly agrees to defend Surratt before a military tribunal. Aiken realizes his client may be innocent and that she is being used as bait and hostage in order to capture the only conspirator to have escaped a massive manhunt, her own son, John (Johnny Simmons).
